#### Part 1: Conference Information Card ("Card")

##### I. General Information:

1. Conference Name: Summer Workshop on Interval Methods (SWIM) 2026 ("*Conference*")
2. Conference Date: June 22-24, 2026 ("*Date*")
3. Conference Venue: ul. Prof. S. Łojasiewicza 6, 30-348 Kraków, Faculty of Mathematics and Computer Science of the Jagiellonian University ("*Venue*")
4. Conference Organizer ("*Organizer*"): Jagiellonian University, ul. Gołębia 24, 31-007 Kraków, on whose behalf the activities related to the conduct of the Conference are performed by the organizational unit: Faculty of Mathematics and Computer Science of the Jagiellonian University, Department of Computational Mathematics of the Institute of Computer Science and Computational Mathematics, ul. Łojasiewicza 6, 30-348 Kraków. The Conference will be financed from the own funds of the Faculty of Mathematics and Computer Science of the Jagiellonian University, the own funds of the Institute of Computer Science and Computational Mathematics of the Jagiellonian University, funds of the Faculty of Mathematics and Computer Science of the Jagiellonian University from the program for co-financing the organization of conferences and international workshops within the Strategic Program "Excellence Initiative at the Jagiellonian University," and from proceeds from conference fees.

9. Registration Form: an electronic form posted on the Registration Page through which registration for participation in the Conference must be made ("*Form*")
10. Form of participation in the Conference: active and passive—the Conference may be attended by Participants presenting Presentations and Participants who are passive listeners.
11. Active participants are Participants presenting a Presentation ("*Speakers*").
12. Rules for qualification for participation in the Conference:
  - a. First, persons who have accepted the Organizer's invitation to participate in the Conference will be qualified to participate;
  - b. Next, the status of Participant will be granted to persons who have expressed a desire for active participation in the Conference, selected by the Scientific Committee based on

a verification of the submitted presentation abstracts, according to the rules indicated in point II of the Card;

- c. Subsequently, subject to availability within the Participant Limit, persons who have expressed a desire for passive participation in the Conference may become Participants, qualified based on the order of applications. In the event a person is not qualified for active participation in the Conference, they may be offered passive participation, subject to the availability of places,

- AND such that have performed correct registration for participation in the Conference according to the rules indicated in the Regulations ("*Rules for qualification for participation in the Conference*").

13. Limit of Participants: 50 ("*Limit*")

14. Resignation from participation in the Conference: by sending information to the Organizer at the e-mail address: robert.szczelina@uj.edu.pl

15. Paid Conference - fee for participation in the Conference ("*Fee*"):

- a. 100 (one hundred) EUR - regular fee
- b. The following are not subject to the Fee: representatives of the Scientific and Organizing Committee of the Conference, Jagiellonian University authorities, and persons recommended or invited to deliver a lecture.

16. Conference Language: English.

## **II. Rules for submitting Presentations ("*Rules for submitting Presentations*"):**

17. Types of conference presentations: lectures and poster session (posters).

18. Rules for sending applications to present a Presentation:

- a. Sending an application: via a special form posted on the Conference Website. Persons who have accepted the Organizer's invitation to participate actively in the Conference may do so via the form or by e-mail to the contact address provided on the Conference Website.
- b. Type of application: an abstract of the Presentation filled out on the template posted on the Conference Website.
- c. Deadline for sending applications: until May 15, 2026 ("*Submission Deadline*")
- d. Method of notification regarding qualification to deliver a Presentation: return e-mail message.
- e. Deadline for notification regarding qualification to deliver a Presentation: May 30, 2026.
- f. Other: in selecting Presentations for the Conference, the Organizer and the Scientific Committee are guided by their own discretion and the necessity of ensuring a high scientific level and thematic diversity of the Conference. The Organizer's decision is final and does not require justification; no appeal shall lie against it.

## **III. Recording the course of the Conference, use of Participants' images**

**Not applicable** - the course of the Conference and the images of Participants will not be recorded using recording devices, neither in the form of a photo report nor in the form of an audio-video recording.

*Terms used in the Regulations written with a capital letter have the meaning assigned to them in the Conference Information Card.*

## **Part 2: Participation Rules – Regulations**

### **§ 1**

#### **Date and Duration**

1. These Regulations specify the rights and obligations of Conference Participants, which will take place on the Date and at the Venue indicated in the Card, in a stationary (on-site) form.
2. A Participant of the Conference is any natural person of legal age with full legal capacity who, within the Registration Deadlines, reported a desire to participate in the Conference or accepted the Organizer's invitation to participate in the Conference and registered participation in the Conference in the manner referred to in § 2 of the Regulations, accepted the Regulations, and received information from the Organizer about being qualified to participate in the Conference (hereinafter referred to as the "Participant").
3. The Regulations are made available to Participants on the Conference Website in a manner that allows them to be downloaded and reproduced without Internet access.
4. The Organizer reserves the right to change the Regulations due to changes in universally binding legal regulations and the necessity of adapting the Regulations to such changes, in particular to increase safety measures accompanying the Conference. A change to the Regulations will enter into force within 7 (seven) days from the moment of its publication on the Conference Website. With regard to Participants who accepted the Regulations before the change was made, the change will enter into force within 7 (seven) days of informing them of the change to the Regulations via electronic mail and the absence of an objection to this change within the aforementioned period.
5. The Organizer also reserves the right to change the Regulations in the event of a change that does not negatively affect the rights of Participants or a change consisting of correcting obvious clerical errors and editorial mistakes. In such a case, the change to the Regulations may enter into force in a term shorter than 7 (seven) days, but not shorter than 3 (three) days from informing Participants of the change to the Regulations via electronic mail and the absence of an objection to this change within the aforementioned period.
6. The Organizer reserves the right to change the Date and the formula of the Conference in a situation where its conduct on the Date and in the form referred to in paragraph 1 above is impossible or excessively difficult for reasons independent of the Organizer. A change of the Date and/or formula of the Conference will be immediately announced on the Conference Website.
7. The Conference program is announced on the Conference Website. The Organizer reserves the possibility of introducing changes to the Conference program, including changes to the time schedule and the sequence of presentations. In the event of introducing changes, the

Organizer will inform of this immediately on the Conference Website. A change to the Conference program does not constitute a change to the Regulations.

## **§ 2**

### **Registration for Participation**

1. Participation in the Conference requires prior registration by filling out and sending the Form posted on the Registration Page.
2. The detailed method of registration for participation in the Conference, including the Participant Limit and the Rules for qualification for participation in the Conference, are provided in the Card.
3. The Organizer is not responsible for the provision of incorrect or false data during registration for participation in the Conference.
4. A person who has registered for participation in the Conference will receive an e-mail message from the Organizer with information regarding their qualification or non-qualification for participation in the Conference.
5. A person registering for participation in the Conference via the Form confirms they have read the Regulations and accept the provisions of the Regulations, which is equivalent to granting the permissions, licenses, and authorizations referred to in the Regulations, and in the case where the Conference is of a paid nature, registration also constitutes an obligation to pay the Fee. Registration of participation in the Conference is completed at the moment the Participant's data is completed in the content of the Form and sent via the system located on the Registration Page.
6. A person who has registered for participation in the Conference acquires a place for participation in the Conference upon receiving confirmation from the Organizer of being qualified for participation in the Conference, and in the case of paid Conferences, additionally after paying the Fee.

## **§ 3**

### **General Rules of Participation**

1. Upon arrival at the Conference Venue, the Participant is obliged to confirm their presence at the reception desk.
  2. In order to ensure safety on the Conference grounds, the Organizer may use monitoring covering the entire Conference area as well as its individual parts. The rules for the use of monitoring by the Organizer are specified in Ordinance No. 34 of the Rector of the Jagiellonian University of May 16, 2019, regarding: Regulations of video monitoring at the Jagiellonian University, as amended, available in the Public Information Bulletin of the Jagiellonian University.
  3. Participants are obliged to comply with safety rules, occupational health and safety (pl. BHP), and fire regulations in force at the facilities where the Conference is organized, as well as the sanitary regime rules in force at that time.
1. In the event of a Participant disturbing public peace and order or failing to comply with the Regulations, Conference personnel are entitled to:

- a. call upon the Participant to behave appropriately;
  - b. demand that the Participant leave the Conference grounds;
  - c. call the appropriate services in a situation where the Participant's behavior qualifies for such intervention, including in particular when it poses a threat to other Participants or Conference personnel or the property of the Organizer.
2. The Organizer bears no responsibility for events resulting from Participants' failure to comply with the Regulations, Participants' failure to follow the recommendations of the Organizer, or the instructions of Conference personnel and services responsible for safety and order.
3. Participants accept the established rules for the course of the Conference and its program and undertake not to influence its change and not to disrupt the course of the Conference. The Organizer is entitled to exclude from participation in the Conference Participants who violate the provisions of the Regulations, and in particular:
  - a. disrupt the course of the Conference;
  - b. undertake actions inconsistent with the law, good customs, or infringing upon the legitimate interests of third parties;
  - c. undertake actions aimed at circumventing or indicating an attempt to circumvent the Regulations or the rules of holding the Conference;
  - d. undertake actions violating the legitimate interests of the Organizer or harming its image.
4. In the event of noticing a threat to the life and health of Participants, the Participant is obliged to immediately inform Conference personnel.
5. In making conference materials (hereinafter referred to as "Conference Materials") available to Participants, the Organizer draws particular attention to the necessity for Participants to respect intellectual property rights. Participants undertake to use the Conference Materials made available to them by the Organizer exclusively for their own personal use. Modifying, copying, transmitting, publicly reproducing, and any use of these Conference Materials for commercial purposes requires the prior written consent of the Organizer or another entitled entity. Participants bear full responsibility for any damages resulting from their behavior contrary to the above reservation.

#### **§ 4**

##### **Presentations**

1. A person registering for participation in the Conference via the Form notifies the Organizer of the desire to deliver a Presentation according to the Rules for submitting Presentations described in the Card.
2. Proceeding in accordance with the Rules for submitting Presentations, including in particular the transfer of the Presentation abstract (hereinafter as: "Abstract") to the Organizer, means granting the Organizer a non-exclusive license, unlimited in time, territory, and quantity, to use the Abstract, with the right to grant sublicenses to third parties with a scope analogous to the scope of the license, for the purposes of making a decision on qualifying a given

person to deliver a Presentation, preparation, organization, conduct, and settlement of the Conference, preparation of Conference Materials, including an Abstract book, and for the purposes of promoting the Conference and disseminating information about the course of the Conference. The subject license includes the use of the Abstract in whole or in part, independently, as well as within a collective work, in combination with works and elements freely chosen by the Organizer, in the following fields of exploitation:

- a. making it available on the Internet, as well as within any telecommunications services using any systems and devices, on all profiles of the Organizer on social networking sites, on the Organizer's websites, and on the Conference Website;
- b. recording, permanent or temporary reproduction of the Abstract in whole or in part by any means and in any form using all available techniques;
- c. within the scope of dissemination of the Abstract – public performance, exhibition, display, reproduction, and broadcasting and rebroadcasting, as well as making it publicly available in such a way that everyone can have access to it in a place and at a time chosen by them, broadcasting by means of a multimedia and teleinformatics network;
- d. within the scope of trade in the original or copies on which the Abstract has been recorded – placing on the market, lending, or renting the original or copies;
- e. creating and disseminating derivative works of the Abstract, including further projects/materials based on the Abstract or its individual elements, and using such created derivative works in the scope and in all fields of exploitation specified in this paragraph;
- f. rebroadcasting, dissemination in the press, on the Internet, on large-format posters, and in all other forms of promotion or advertising;
- g. modifying the Abstract in whole or in part and making developments of it in whole or in part.

The license also includes the authorization for the Organizer to exercise and permit third parties to exercise derivative rights to the Abstract, in all fields of exploitation referred to in this paragraph. The provisions of paragraphs 3, 4, 5, and 7 of this section apply accordingly to the Abstract. In the event that a Participant sends an Abstract to the Organizer for a purpose other than the selection of applications, the provisions of this paragraph shall apply accordingly.

3. A Participant qualified by the Organizer to deliver a Presentation and a person who has accepted the Organizer's invitation to present a Presentation (each hereinafter as: "Speaker") bears full responsibility for the form and content of the Presentation.
4. The Speaker undertakes to develop and present an original Presentation and guarantees that the Presentation will not violate the rights and personal interests of third parties, nor contain theses and views inciting hatred or discrimination against any persons on the grounds of race, culture, ethnicity, religion, worldview, or gender. Furthermore, it is unacceptable to promote ideologies and symbolism associated with totalitarian regimes in the content of the

Presentation, as well as to present other subject matter prohibited by universally binding regulations or to violate the good name of the Organizer.

5. If any part of the Presentation consists of legally protected elements to which the rights do not belong to the Speaker, the Speaker guarantees that they are entitled to use them in the scope necessary to deliver the Presentation and to grant the Organizer the license with the right to grant sublicenses referred to in this paragraph, without the necessity for the Organizer to obtain additional consents and permissions.
6. Upon the presentation of the Presentation, the Speaker grants the Organizer a non-exclusive license to use the Presentation, in combination with works and elements freely chosen by the Organizer (including, among others, the Presentations of other Speakers, image, and sound), including the public presentation of the Presentation by the Speaker during the time and at the place of the Conference, in particular its exhibition or delivery.
7. The Speaker undertakes not to exercise against the Organizer and entities authorized by it their moral rights to the Presentation, and in particular the right to the inviolability of the content and form of the Presentation and its reliable use – provided that this use occurs in a manner consistent with the License, deciding on the first public availability of the Presentation, supervision over the method of using the Presentation, and deciding on the method of designating the author of the Presentation, with the reservation that the Organizer, at the Speaker's request and as far as possible, is obliged to respect the Speaker's wish regarding designating them as the person presenting the Presentation.
8. In the event of third parties reporting claims to the Organizer and/or entities acting on its behalf and/or entities authorized by it to use the Presentation and/or Abstract (hereinafter jointly referred to as "Entitled Entities") in connection with the Presentation and/or Abstract or their individual elements, the Speaker:
  - a. shall release the Organizer and/or Entitled Entities from the said claims, to the extent they were obliged to acquire from third parties the rights to legally protected elements of the Presentation and/or Abstract, including economic copyrights and related rights to them and their individual elements, authorization to exercise and permit the exercise of derivative rights, and to obtain from them the permissions and authorizations referred to in this paragraph; and
  - b. shall bear full responsibility for all damages suffered by the Organizer and/or Entitled Entities due to claims being brought against them as referred to above, including primarily, though not exclusively, for damages related to a claim for compensation for the unlawful use of the Presentation and/or Abstract or the unlawful use of their individual elements.

## **§ 5**

### **Final Provisions**

1. These Regulations are made available to Participants on the Conference Website in a manner that allows them to be downloaded and reproduced without Internet access and enter into force on the day of their posting on the aforementioned website.

2. The presentation of the Presentation, as well as the granting to the Organizer of the licenses, permissions, and authorizations referred to in the Regulations (for the use of the Abstract, Presentation), in the scope and in all fields of exploitation indicated therein, is free of charge and occurs for the statutory purposes of the Organizer, subject to separate agreements concluded with the Speaker.
3. The granting to the Organizer of the licenses, permissions, and authorizations referred to in the Regulations is voluntary but necessary to present the Presentation.
4. The Organizer will immediately inform of the cancellation of the Conference on the Conference Website. The Organizer will not be obliged to any compensation or damages toward Participants, including Speakers, on this account, nor to the reimbursement of costs incurred for the purpose of participating in the Conference, with the exception of the reimbursement of the Fee – in the case where the Conference is of a paid nature.
5. Subject to mandatory provisions of law, the law applicable to the agreement for participation in the Conference concluded through acceptance of the Regulations is Polish law; in matters not regulated by the Regulations, the universally binding provisions of Polish law shall apply, in particular the Civil Code and the Act of February 4, 1994, on Copyright and Related Rights.
6. Subject to mandatory provisions of law, all disputes will be subject to the jurisdiction of Polish common courts of general jurisdiction.
7. These Regulations have been prepared in two language versions—Polish and English; in the event of interpretative discrepancies, the Polish version shall be decisive.
8. The Conference Card is an integral part of the Regulations.
9. Information on the processing of personal data of Participants constitutes an annex to the Regulations.
